- To appreciate and value the role of teaching Qur'an even more

INTRODUCTION TO THE BOOK:

- To teach the Qur'an is challenging but rewarding
- Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) was the greatest example as a teacher
- Each pupil is different when it comes to teaching the Qur'an
- As Muslims, we must always strive for Itqan (Excellence) in everything that we do



TIP 1: INTENTIONS & VIRTUES FOR TEACHING QUR'AN

- Intention is the most important part of the Qur'anic teaching journey
- Good deeds must be accompanied by sincere intentions
- Do not just make an intention to teach Qur'an purely for monetary gains
- Ultimate reward is from Allah
- Endless cycle of rewards (Sadaqah Jariyah)



TIP 2: MENTAL HEALTH, PREPARATION & ORGANISATION

- The mental health of teachers is fundamental
- Islam values the maintenance of good mental health and emotional well-being
- Preparation is essential and key to successful Qur'anic teaching
- "If you fail to plan, you plan to fail"
- The organisation of a teacher reflects in the classroom environment. Be organised!



TIP 3: EXAMPLES OF PROPHETIC TEACHING

- The Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) was the best teacher of all time!
- Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) was able to engage and talk to a wide range of audiences
- His character and wisdom was exemplary
- He was able to acknowledge and make every student feel important
- He understood all of his students!

TIP 4: EXPLORING OUTSTANDING QUR'ANIC TEACHING

- There is no universal or golden rule on becoming an outstanding teacher
- It does not happen overnight!
- Every lesson has to be as successful as the previous one
- It's not just about teaching, it's about inspiring and motivating your students
- Always have the mentality to continuously develop and improve as a teacher



TIP 5: HOW TO MOTIVATE, ENCOURAGE & ENGAGE YOUR STUDENTS

- Most students are driven by emotion and praise
- Motivating students to learn the Qur'an can be very challenging
- Encouraging students also involves being a mentor and a coach
- Keep the Qur'an lessons relevant, exciting and interesting
- The main aim is to ensure that your students do not ever lose interest or focus in the Qur'an!



TIP 6: TEACHING QUR'AN TO CHILDREN AT HOME

- Teaching the Qur'an to your child is a major bonding experience
- As a parent, aim to instil the love of the Qur'an from a young age
- Encourage the use of technology to help build the love of the Qur'an into your child
- Parents need to take more of an active role and invest time in teaching the Qur'an to their children
- The connection a child has with his/her parent is always stronger than a teacher!



TIP 7: TEACHING QUR'AN TO LEARNERS WITH SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

- This topic is hugely undervalued and underrepresented within the Muslim community
- Spotting a student with SEND is not easy!
- The ultimate goal is to make the Qur'an accessible to everyone, regardless of learning abilities
- We need to support SEND students and NOT push them away!



TIP 8: TOP TIPS TO TEACH ARABIC

- Teaching Arabic (especially to non-Arab students) is very challenging and requires patience
- Give as much exposure to the Arabic language as possible
- Use simple and common words, phrases and sentences to teach Arabic
- Remember, you are not just teaching them any language but the language of the Qur'an!



TIP 9: EXPLORING BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT STRATEGIES

- Managing behaviour is crucial to the success of your student's Qur'anic learning
- Most students misbehave due to: feeling bored, the lesson is not engaging or they are struggling to understand or complete work
- Misbehaviour is not a personal attack on your teaching capabilities
- Try to be as proactive and positive as possible!

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TIP 10: TEACHING QUR'AN MEMORISATION (HIFDH) EFFECTIVELY

- Teaching hifdh is unique. You are more of a mentor and a coach
- Understand and appreciate the enormous rewards associated with hifdh (teaching and learning)
- It is not just about teaching students how to memorise or recite Qur'an correctly
- Teaching students how to implement the Qur'an into their lives is more important

TIP 11: TEACHING TAJWID AND VOICE BEAUTIFICATION

- Tajweed always takes preference over voice beautification
- As teachers, we must uphold the highest standards in preserving the correct rules of recitation
- Tajweed comes from the root word 'to make something better'
- 'Beautify the Qur'an with your voices' (Prophet Muhammad PBUH)
- Not every student is gifted with a melodious or beautiful voice
- Teach students to always maintain the utmost humility



TIP 12: TEACHING QUR'AN TO ADULTS

- There is no age limit to learning the Qur'an
- Every adult learner faces the disadvantage of time
- Keep the Qur'anic progress balanced, especially for adults
- It is never too late to learn the Qur'an
- Always aim to encourage and motivate the adult learners even more than the younger studentd



TIP 13: TEACHING QUR'AN USING TECHNLOGY

- There is growing trend of using technology to teach the Qur'an, especially since Covid-19
- Not every Qur'an teacher is 'tech savvy.' Training is so crucial
- Carry out your own research before deciding which technological tool will be the most feasible and effective for you
- Embrace the digital age!



TIP 14: REWARDING STUDENTS FOR QUR'ANIC ACHIEVEMENTS

- Rewarding and praising students can lead to excellent results in terms of Qur'anic learning progress
- Do not make students feel undervalued or underappreciated
- Implementing a consistent rewards system can help to build a positive and vibrant learning environment
- Rewards can mean that students will show an increased effort



TIP 15: SETTING TARGETS AND MEASURING PROGRESS

- Setting realistic and achievable targets is so crucial to a student's Qur'anic learning progress
- Measuring progress allows you to measure the success of your teaching methods
- Short, medium and long term progress. What does it look like?
- Always keep parents informed of their child's progress

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TIP 16: THE BRIDGE FROM QA'IDAH TO QUR'AN

- Do not start your students learning Qa'idah at the wrong age!
- How accurate and fluently is your student or child able to recite the Qur'an?
- Fix recitation or Tajweed errors immediately, before more errors are made by the students
- Make a regular habit of re-testing your student's progress in Qa'idah



TIP 17: OVERCOMING COMMON CHALLENGES TO TEACHING QUR'AN

- There is no exhaustive list on barriers and challenges faced when teaching the Qur'an
- Learning how to overcome a challenge is so crucial
- Lack of parental involvement within their child's Qur'an learning journey
 - Keep on going and never give up!

TIP 18: PROVIDING EFFECTIVE FEEDBACK

- Balance the positive and negative feedback comments
- Do not aim to make a student feel defeated through feedback
- Providing feedback is an art in itself
- Articulate your thoughts correctly so that students appreciate and value your feedback comments
- Timing of feedback is so crucial!

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TIP 19: SELF-REFLECTION AND EVALUATION

- Many teachers struggle to find regular time to evaluate their teaching performance
- Reflection is a core part of a teacher's professional development
- Reflective teaching is so powerful
- Two main types of evaluation: evaluating how much students progressed in the lesson and evaluating your performance as a teacher



TIP 20: BE A QUR'ANIC ROLE MODEL FOR LIFE!

- Acting upon the Qur'an is the most important aspect of a Qur'anic journey
- A true person of Qur'an must always act in accordance with its teachings
- As a teacher, always strive to be a role model for your students
- Actions speak louder than words!
